In view of the increasing crime rate, the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) set up a the “Crime Research Center” as early as 1964 despite the lack of manpower and funding.

In 2013, “Crime Prevention Research Center” was formally established by the Academy for the Judiciary.

ORGANIZATION

Crime Prevention Research Center has 1 director, 2 administration staffs, 1 research fellow, 1 associate research fellow, 2 assistant research fellows, and 4 research assistants.

Experts and scholars in the criminal justice field are invited to be advisory committee members and contracted researchers.
